



Micah Henry Groseclose
08/09/1979 – 02/10/2021

Micah Henry Groseclose (“Goose”) was born August 9, 1979, in Fort Worth, Texas and passed away on February 10, 2021, in San Antonio, Texas at 41 years of age after a cardiac event.

Micah grew up in an Army family, which revealed his gift of quickly making friends in new places. He attended many schools throughout the United States and Germany, including Robert G. Cole Jr./Sr. High School in San Antonio. He graduated from Waynesville (Missouri) High School and had plans to attend college on a football scholarship at Southwest Baptist University in Boliver, Missouri.

Micah was a gifted athlete and especially loved wrestling and football. His plans to play college football were never fulfilled, however. Micah was involved in a motor vehicle accident on March 8, 1998, at the end of his senior year of high school and sustained a traumatic brain injury. The same drive that made him a phenomenal wrestler and football player led him to a lifetime of working on his recovery and rehabilitation, even though his injury left him with limited physical abilities.

Micah didn’t allow his disabilities to hold him down and grew deep in his relationship with the Lord. He was greatly involved in his church, Alamo City Christian Fellowship and was always eager to go to their services with the help of his friend Joe Nekuda. He found opportunities to pray for people wherever he went, including his fellow residents at the Meridian Care Center. Even following the restrictions put in place due to Covid, he continued to pray for his fellow residents at night as he wheeled past their doors.

Micah felt blessed to reside in the Meridian Care Center the last few years of his life. He was loved by many of his caregivers and he loved them as well. The family expresses their deep appreciation for the high level of care and compassion Micah received during his time at Meridian.

Micah is survived by his parents, Gordon and Debbie Groseclose; sister, Angela Foster; brother-in-law, Dan Foster; and nephew, Jonathan Foster, all of Port Orchard, Washington.

Micah has one surviving grandparent, Doratha Groseclose of Greybull, Wyoming, and numerous aunts, uncles, and cousins. Joe Nekuda, a beloved family friend and brother in Christ, coordinated Micah's care in San Antonio.

Micah was loved by many friends and especially by his church home at Alamo City Christian Fellowship in San Antonio.

One of Micah's favorite verses is found in Psalms 20:7: "Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the Lord our God." Micah continued to place his trust in the Lord each day and he endured with perseverance and great joy. He longed for other people to find the same hope and joy in Christ.
