



Sidney Farrell Goslin
10/21/1925 – 09/9/2020

Sidney Farrell Goslin went to heaven on Wednesday, September 9, 2020. Sid had been living at Regent Care Medical Center since February.

Sid was born in Devine, Texas on October 21, 1925 to William "Turner" Goslin and Louise Schneider Goslin. He graduated from South San High School, San Antonio in 1944, and was then drafted into the US Army. Sid served as PFC in the Luzon Campaign and Japan Occupation.

After the war Sid graduated with a BA degree from St Mary's University in 1951. He completed almost 34 years of federal service, most of which were at Kelly AFB.

Sid and Shirley McKernan, of Omaha, Nebraska, began a friendship as pen pals while Sid was serving in the Pacific. Shirley moved to San Antonio in 1949 to be near her future husband. They were married May 27, 1950 at Harlandale Baptist Church in San Antonio.

Sid and Shirley spent all their married life in San Antonio and lived in the same house since the late 1950's. They were active members at Harlandale Baptist Church for almost 40 years, and later became Charter Members of Alamo City Christian Fellowship (now known as Alamo City Church.) In his early years, Sid taught youth in Sunday School, then young married adults and later adults of his age-group... over 53 years as a Sunday School teacher. He was an Old Testament scholar, and loved to talk about the thread God wove through the Bible.

Sid loved to play the guitar and sing country western songs in the era of Jim Reeves and Eddy Arnold. After retirement, Sid joined long-time friends to start Ralph and the Western Stars, playing at nursing homes in the San Antonio area. Sid ended those weekly events when Shirley's health began to fail. In later years, Sid also played with the American Legion Post 592 at the Warrior and Family Support Center at Fort Sam Houston.

Sid was preceded in death by his parents and then Shirley in 2009. He is survived by his three daughters,

Sharon Oldfield (Don) of Graham, Texas, Karen Moneyhun (Sam) of Fairfax Station, Virginia and Terri "Taz" Stanfill (Gary) of San Antonio. The next generation includes his granddaughters, Lauren Mahan (Kris) of Wichita Falls, Texas and Kristina Moneyhun of Chicago, Illinois, and granddogs O'Connor and Patrick Stanfill. Also surviving Sid is his Big Brother, William "Bill" Goslin, Jr. of San Antonio, his cousin Edwin "Eddie" Hutzler of Devine and numerous nieces and nephews.
